Fish stunned by Olympic move

LONDON Electric stun guns are being used to move some of the last aquatic residents from the site of the 2012 Olympic stadium.

Workers on boats are using the devices to stun fish, such as eels, tench, bream and pike, which live in the Pudding Mill river in East London. Once they float to the surface, they are collected and taken to the nearby River Lea.

Their former home is on the site for the Olympic park. Nearby areas of land are contaminated.
